Divine Mercy prayer/study group - The next meeting will be Saturday February 23rd 2.00- 4.00pm in the Upper Room NOT the Lower Room. In line with the Year Of Faith the topic this month is tracing Our Sins Back To Adam & Eve. A CD talk by Johnny Garcia (an American apologist). PASTORAL NOTES

A NIGHT-PRAYER

2nd February is the feast of the Presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple, by Mary and Joseph, when the old priest Simeon, who has waited for this moment all his life, takes the child in his arms, saying, "Now at last your servant can go in peace, according to your promise. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared for all nations – the Light to enlighten the Nations, and give glory to your people, Israel". This prayer, read in the Gospel of the Presentation Feast, has been adopted as the official night-prayer of the Church, remembering, at the end of the day, Jesus as 'the Light' – the Light of the world. – So the Feast is also called 'Candlemas', when all the congregation may light candles, carried in procession, showing Christ's Light shared with us all.
