PASTORAL NOTES

ST JOSAPHAT (12th November)

We have welcomed priests and student-priests over recent years from many parts of the world, including a young man from Ukraine. In the early 1600s St Josaphat (bishop) was able to lead a substantial part of that population to unity with the Catholic Church, at the cost of his life. The Orthodox Church remains the major Church in that part of the world, in Russia particularly, and eastern Europe in general though also world-wide through emigration. Some will be familiar with the Orthodox Church in Greece and Turkey. Pope John Paul, who visited the Patriarch in Turkey, felt we were like a person with one lung, divided from the Orthodox Church (the great split came around 1000 AD). The Catholic Ukrainian Church has kept all the eastern tradition of the Mass, with its very lovely music, and a great monastic tradition. Our bishops may well be studying the Orthodox approach to difficulties in marriage when they gather next year for a discussion of Marriage and Family in our time.
