PASTORAL TEACHINGS

NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS

You may have read in the parish newsletter or in the Catholic press that a somewhat new translation of the Mass has been prepared in Rome, to begin part use in SEPTEMBER. Over the coming weeks the PASTORAL NOTES will be devoted to indicate/explain these changes. In part they are to be a more literal translation of the original Latin version of the Mass. In part an effort has been made to make clearer some of the quotations from the Scriptures which appear in our prayers. Comments and questions are always welcome, in writing if you wish, and I understand that there will be a chance in the diocese, in October, for clergy and congregations to respond to the changes. The complete Missal will be in use from the First Sunday of Advent, 26/27th November.
