FULL OF GRACE



The birth of Mary cannot be separated from the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Contemplation of one leads to contemplation of the other. The Immaculate Conception recognises that as part of God's plan to save Mankind and restore to us the possibility of eternal life, Mary was chosen to be the mother of His Son. Thus, the Word could be made flesh, live amongst us, teach us and make the supreme sacrifice in order that our relationship with God be restored. Mary was therefore immaculate (free from Original Sin) from the moment of her conception within the womb of her mother, Anne. This week September 8th. marks the feast day of Mary's birth, the next stage of God's plan.

The feast of Mary's birth dates back to the spirituality of the second century and its zeal to fill-in narratives where the gospels were silent. Veneration of Mary had its beginnings at this time. The apocryphal writing, Protoevangelium of James, tried to address the question of Mary's origins. From this we received the names of her parents (Anne and Joachim) and the story of her young life. This feast not only celebrates the birth of Mary, it also celebrates the spirit of the early Christians in their quest to honour the Mother of Our Lord.

Mary was full of grace from her conception. We thank God for her birth and for her parents who raised her to know and love God. We particularly praise her obedience to God in agreeing to bear His Son in spite of possible dangers to her life and the certainty of difficulties and sorrows. But it did not end there. Whilst being a good mother, from the moment of His conception in her womb, she was also the first and closest of Jesus' disciples.

In celebrating Mary's Birthday this year, perhaps we can ask her to help us become closer disciples of her dear Son?

NEW START FOR OUR POTTERS AND THEIR CLAY

I dreamed I stood in a studio and watched two sculptors there.

The clay they used was a young child's mind and they fashioned it with care.

One was a teacher and the tools used were books, music and art.

The other a parent, working with guiding hand and gentle, loving heart.

Day after day the teacher toiled with touch that was deft and sure,

While the parent laboured close nearby and polished and smoothed it o'er.

And when their task was done, they were proud of what they had wrought

For the things they had moulded into a child could neither be sold nor bought.

And each agreed they would have failed if each had worked alone,

For behind the parents stood the school and behind the teacher stood a home.



What scripture does this poem remind us of, with its references to sculptors and clay? "Lord, You are our Father; we are the clay. You are our potter; we are the work of your hand."

As well as its obvious link to Isaiah 64:8, the poem highlights the shared responsibilities which parents and teachers (the potters) have in the shaping of our children's minds, beliefs and personalities (the clay). Of course, this starts in the family and continues in family life so the prime "sculptor" is the parent operating in the Domestic Church. Yet, what some call "progressive" developments in society are in many cases threatening the values of marriage and family life as upheld by the Church. Indeed Sr. Lucia (Fatima apparitions) gave a warning from Our Lady that the main battleground between Satan and God would be in the area of family life.

As students return to a new academic year, parents who are interested in developing their awareness of such threats and considering the possible ramifications of these in their own family, might like to watch this interview of the Family Education Trust, an organisation fighting for traditional family values within education. Its director raises the phenomenon of "social contagion" - that is, children adopting certain behaviours or beliefs to add to their 'social credit' in order to fit in with their peers. He encourages parents to enquire into their children's education and urges them to make sure their family views and principles are represented. To aid this, the Association of Christian Teachers (ACT) has published its findings about how traditional views of marriage and gender are being treated in an alarming number of cases.

We would like to take this opportunity to wish all the students a very safe, happy and productive school year. Also, we thank all our potters, parents and teachers alike, for their hard work and dedication.
