

#### **BISHOP DAVID'S ADVENT MESSAGE**



#### To my dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In this first week of the advent season, I wish to consider the theme of 'Hope'. Let me share with you some words from the Prophet Isaiah, "Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonguil, let it rejoice and sing for joy". I love the words of the prophets because they speak to us so eloquently of what hope involves. They looked forward to a time they could not imagine in their own life experience. They looked forward to a time when God would do something new, then the Lord would renew and refresh his people. I think that pinpoints the meaning of hope, we do not hope in ourselves or what the human race can achieve by its own effort. Hope is rooted in what God will do. Hope is founded upon the concept of salvation history that the Lord has made promises to his people and he will fulfil them. And so, you may imagine that God has already fulfilled his promises by sending his beloved Son, the word made flesh, Jesus. However, some of God's promises still remain to be fulfilled. Jesus has promised that he will come again at the end of time, in glory he will return in majesty and the whole of creation will recognize him. There is a tremendous amount of Hope involved in that promise. Some days when we look around our world, its darkness and its shadows, we simply cannot imagine a day of glory that the scriptures speak to us of. And yet that is the meaning of Hope. Maranatha, come Lord Jesus, come and make the wastelands blossom and you come and let the desert sing for joy.

#### WHY DID GOD MAKE US?



Did you ever get a satisfactory answer to this question which we may have asked of our elders as we were growing up?

Paul writes that God created us with the intent of adopting us as His children "blameless down before Him in love, preordaining us for adoption as sons through Jesus Christ to Him". In response to this gift, we are to worship Him in love. Such worship was not restricted to Sunday mornings; it began with the assembly but spilled out into the week's activities. Such worship was to be found in praise and charity.

Those who humbly try to avoid praise are sometimes lavished with honour. They respond with surprise or remarks that attempt to deflect the spotlight. They act with humility because they feel they did not earn the honour bestowed. Two millennia ago, a young woman called Mary tried to deflect an honour given her - but the giver and the gift were too great to be ignored.

Let's consider the place of girls like Mary in the social pecking order of first century Palestine. In a gender segregated male dominated society, young girls were sheltered from the outside world in order to protect their virginity and insure the honour of the family. (The murder of promiscuous or even raped young girls by family members was not uncommon to uphold family honour.) In addition, young girls were not educated. Literacy lay with the male, since females were considered too inferior and emotional for education. Girls like Mary stood at the bottom of proper society.

Imagine, then, Mary's reaction when the angel Gabriel proposed for her a conception and birth that could endanger her arranged marriage with Joseph and put her life at risk. (According to Deuteronomy 22:20-21, a girl who was not a virgin before marriage could be stoned to death). To overcome Mary's concern, the angel proclaimed her honour before God, saying she was highly favoured by the Almighty and her Son would be highly favoured by God.

Mary's response revealed her character. Having protested to Gabriel so she could protect her honour and the honour of her family, she gave up all that for a higher honour - one she did not deserve but one that she was made for. God created her to be

the mother of His Son. In this way, she showed herself to be a faithful Jew and the first follower of the One she would bear into the world.

The Lord destined us to live blameless lives. While this is a daunting task, the Church presented us with this model of Mary to help us. We celebrate the Feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8<sup>th</sup>. with this notion in mind. Mary's response showed us that she was a blameless and willing vessel for God's providence. We honour her for the favour the Father showed her and for her positive response. The Church proclaimed her to be holy and blameless in the eyes of the Lord from the moment of her conception. She was preordained to serve the Lord in love.

Reflecting on the Immaculate Conception might help us to answer the title question - What were we made for? St. Paul's eloquence in his letter to the Ephesians (1:3-6) on this subject is summed up in our Catechism thus: *God made us to know Him, to love Him, to serve Him in this world and to be happy with Him for ever in Heaven.* Mary is what we are called to be like, because her role in the birth of the Christ should remind us of our own role in the world, to serve the Lord with blameless and holy hearts whilst waiting for Heaven.
