BISHOP DAVID'S ADVENT MESSAGE



To my dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In this second week of advent, we will reflect for a moment on the theme of peace. Of course, when we look around our world today, during these advent weeks, we see so much need for peace. We see peace needed in the wars that are taking place in the Ukraine and in the Holy Land. We see the need for peace in our communities, we recognise the need for peace within our families and perhaps we recognise too, the need for peace within ourselves as individuals. As always, I would like to share with you a few words from the Advent scriptures. These are the words of the Prophet Isaiah used by the evangelist Luke to talk about the ministry of John, the son of Zechariah, the one who would be known as the Baptist. "A voice cries in the wilderness. 'Prepare a way for the lord, make his paths straight'. Every valley will be filled in, every mountain and hill will be made low, winding waves will be straightened and rough roads made smooth and all mankind will see the salvation of God". This is the peace that the Lord speaks of in his Word, it is a peace which begins when we are open and receptive to the Word of God, to the power of God, His Kingdom at work in our lives, and it involves some hard works. The prophet puts it in those beautiful and familiar terms, about hills being laid low and about valleys being filled in. Sometimes when I'm driving and see workmen on the motorway, it reminds me how challenging it is to keep that road straight that we use so often to get around the place. Then I look inside myself and I recognise that peace comes at a cost. Peace was won for us by our Lord's death on the cross and when we receive the grace of that cross into our lives, then we are at peace with almighty God. So let's pray for peace in our world and let us recognise that the journey towards worldwide peace, comes with that step of peace within ourselves. When we respond to the invitation of God to become peacemakers, not least, and first of all, within ourselves.

LOST CHILDREN



If a man has 100 sheep and one of them goes astray, doesn't he leave the 99, go to the mountains, and seek the one which has gone astray? In this passage from Matthew, Jesus mixed the image of the sheep and the "little ones". In context, Jesus spoke to His followers about children (Matthew 18:1-12), so to really understand the verses, we must investigate the status of children in ancient society.

The place of the child in the time of Jesus was the exact opposite of his or her place in modern Western culture. Children lay at the bottom of the social ladder, whereas elders stood at the top. Parents had children for primarily economic reasons; love was a secondary reason. Children were labourers who increased the worth of the clan as a whole and provided care for the parents in their old age. Since half of all children died before the age of 16 (from many diseases we now vaccinate against), conditions encouraged people to have as many offspring as possible. So, the notion of a lost child ("sheep"), while tragic, would not bring the economic efforts of a clan to a standstill in a world where most people lived below a subsistence level. Yet that was the ideal Jesus held up.

If we consider the symbolic meaning of the term "child", it could refer to the core audience Jesus served (the outcast, the sinner, the ill) or it could refer to a fellow Christian (as a "child" of God). No matter the reference, however, Jesus desired extra attention paid to the lost child, the outcast in society, the errant sinner. This care was a key component of ministry.

How can we care for the "lost child" in our lives this week?

Later in the week's readings, Jesus also uses an agricultural metaphor to describe discipleship (Matthew 11:28-30). He implicitly portrayed the religious life of the Jew (we assume) under the Pharisees as a heavily burdened lifestyle, like that of a yoked oxen driven by a farmer to plough a field. Life for the Jewish Christian would be easier, not necessarily because discipleship freed him from the duties of the Torah, but freed him from the responsibility of salvation. The responsibility of his soul did not lie simply in his own efforts, but in the One who died for all. Following the Christ and sharing in His very life lifted the burden of conscience; the disciple did not have to please God alone; he had a Saviour who did that for him.

• The Priest takes the oil and anoints the sick person. He anoints first on the forehead, saying: *Through this holy anointing, may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit.*

You will answer: Amen.

• Then on the hands, saying: May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.



You will answer: Amen.
